WHY WHITEWASHING?



Whitewashing: The intentional or unintentional erasure or transformation of people of color in media, literature and society in order to present ideas or people as "White," or more acceptable.



Stereotype: A generalized belief about a particular category of people.



Portray: To describe or showcase (someone or something) in a particular way.


