

Poetry is deeply connected to hip-hop. Can you think of examples?





WHAT is poetry?

CYPHER PROTOCOL

1) Walk around the room.

Round 1: Share something you love so much that you would want to write a letter to it.

Round 2: Share what stood out to you in the poem.

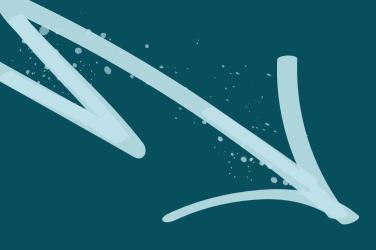



POETRY SLAM INSPIRATION

A Poetry Slam is an art competition in which contestants perform personal pieces of lyrics, poetry or other forms of spoken word.

Like any competition, there are winners, losers and rules.



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POETRY SLAM INSPIRATION

5 SEL SKILLS TO SPOT

- **Self-Awareness** = knowledge of yourself
- **Social-Awareness** = knowledge of society and current events
- **Responsible Decision Making** = making smart choices
- **Relationship Skills** = managing and maintaining healthy relationships
- **Self-Management** = having self-control, self-regulation



REMEMBER, THIS IS JUST PRACTICE! YOUR POEM DOES NOT HAVE TO BE PERFECT.


